The Wild Rose Welsh & Open Pony Show competition is sanctioned as a Wild Rose Provincial circuit competition of the Alberta Equestrian Federation. It will run in accordance to the AEF Wild Rose Competition Rulebook.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Wild Rose Competition Rulebook and will be held and judged in accordance with the Rulebook.

Every Participant at the AEF Wild Rose Competition shall agree that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the competition and rules of the competition.

General Information & Rules

1. All owners, exhibitors, riders, drivers, and handlers *must* be current AEF members (or belong to the appropriate CEF-affiliated provincial organization for out-of-province exhibitors, or for Americans, have a United States Equestrian Federation membership). Please list membership numbers on your entry forms. Any entry received without the necessary AEF numbers **will be returned**. The list of exhibitors' AEF numbers will be submitted to AEF for verification.
2. The Show/Rules Committee reserves the right to decide upon any point not covered by the rules, prize list, and/or program/schedule, as well as to amend any rules that the Committee deems necessary to change.

3. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience to show officials by an owner/lessee, groom, rider or driver, the offender will be reported to the Show Committee, excused from the show, and all fees will be forfeited. The Show Committee reserves the right and power to remove any owner/lessee, groom, rider, or horse from the show and/or the show grounds without being held liable for any compensation whatsoever. The Show Commission reserves the right to not accept an individual's entries at its discretion and for any reason.
4. Neither the Welsh Show Association, the Wildrose Show Committee, nor Olds Agricultural Society will be responsible for any loss, damage, or injury to persons, ponies/horses, or property at this show. No entries will be accepted without signed releases. **There is a separate release form for junior and senior exhibitors.**
5. No persons, other than the show officials, may enter the ring without permission of the Show Committee, judges or steward.
6. Any exhibitor in the ring with the wrong number or having no number may be excused from the class. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure he/she is wearing the correct number. Exhibitors will ensure that proper attire is worn for each class. Competition must be worn and visible at all times.
7. Classes where there are less than **three** entries may or may not be combined or cancelled, at the discretion of the Show Secretary (in the case of cancellation, entry fees will be refunded).
8. Exhibitors who cancel their entries forfeit all fees unless the cancellation is accompanied by a vet certificate indicating the pony in question is sick or injured and unable to compete. Any entry cancelled that is accompanied by a vet certificate will be charged a 20% processing fee on the total entry/office fees paid. All stabling fees will be refunded in full. Substitutions will be permitted one week prior at the discretion of the show committee.
9. It is up to each exhibitor to determine the time of classes. Due to time constraints, there will be a **three-minute gate hold limit** from the time the gate is opened. Gate holds must be requested of the secretary at least one session prior.
10. It is up to each exhibitor to determine which championship halter classes they qualify for and to be at the gate, ready to compete, in the appropriate halter championship classes at the correct time.
11. All exhibitors should check in with the hitching ring gate attendant before each class. Allow plenty of time. If an exhibitor must **scratch a class**, please notify the show office in advance.
12. Copies of all registration papers and/or lease agreements, or both, or proof of eligibility to be registered and proof of ownership must be produced **if requested**. Inability to produce these copies of registration papers will deem the animal unable to compete at this show.
13. All entries must be made in the name of the registered owner(s) or lessee(s).
14. The performance division of this show is open to all breeds, unless otherwise stated.
15. **All persons riding anywhere on the competition grounds must wear protective headgear secured with a safety harness permanently affixed to the helmet.** The harness must be secured and properly fitted. It is recommended that the protective headgear meet the American Society for Testing Materials standard and display the Safety Equipment Institute seal. Approved riding helmets must be used in all ridden classes. Helmets are mandatory for juniors in Western riding and senior Western riders. Helmets are encouraged for juniors in showmanship and halter classes. **Helmets are required for junior driving.**

16. Passengers are allowed in all driving classes. Headers will be allowed in the ring once driving ponies are lined up. Junior drivers under 14 years of ages shall be accompanied on the vehicle by a knowledgeable adult horseperson. Failure to comply shall incur elimination.
17. A second handler will be allowed in line classes, when necessary, to run out a pony/horse. Only one person may handle the animal at any given time at the Wildrose Welsh & Open Pony Show.
18. An **open** class is open to all horses of any age, gender, or breed, and in which there is no qualification for the rider or driver. All are eligible to compete, unless otherwise stated.
Juniors are not to ride/drive stallions.
19. All animals competing may be measured at the judge's and/or steward's discretion.
20. **All registered ponies/horses must be entered under their registered name, no matter the division they compete in.**
21. A **maiden** class is open to ponies/horses/competitors that have not received one first place ribbon at EC or USEF competitions in the particular performance class in which they are shown. A maiden entry is such until the closing date of entries.
22. A **novice** class is open to ponies/horses/competitors who have not won three first place ribbons at Equine Canada or USEF competitions in the particular performance class in which they are shown. A novice entry is such until the closing date of entries.
23. A **green** animal is in its first or second year of showing, and/or is five years of age or under.
24. Break times will be announced in the schedule.
25. Age classifications: all ages will be from January 1st of the current year. "**Senior**" is 18 years and over. "**Junior**" is 17 and under, until the end of the calendar year in which he/she reaches the age of 18. Individuals are seniors from the beginning of the calendar year in which they reach the age of nineteen.
26. Champion of Champions: The Welsh Pony and Cob Association of Ontario hold a special class, the Welsh Champion of Champions, at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair each year. Ponies and cobs qualify throughout the show season to compete for the title. There are three categories to qualify in: Youngstock – Two Years & Under, Mares – Three Years & Over, and Stallions/Geldings – Three Years & Over. The shows that have qualifying classes hold them right after the regular breeding classes. Only purebred registered Welsh ponies and cobs may compete in the qualifying class. The owner of the pony or cob must be a member of their regional Welsh Pony & Cob Association to compete in the Welsh Champion of Champions at the Royal Agricultural Winter Fair.
Please Note: Once an animal has qualified for the finals of the WELSH CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS, it is no longer eligible to compete for a berth in the final qualifying class. In the regular line classes, if the first place animal has previously qualified for the WELSH CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS, the second place animal is eligible to move to the qualifying class at that show. If both the first and second place animal have qualified, then no other animals from the regular line class will go forward into the qualifier.
27. Hors Concours permitted.

It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to **know and to follow the show rules**. We follow the AEF and Equine Canada show rules. Make sure you know the rules and what is expected of you in each class you enter.
